Monthly Report  
Town Council Meeting  
November 8, 2016

- Traffic Safety: HPD officers issued 164 citations and warnings in October. There were 7 traffic crashes reported. 1 occurred on Main Street, 4 at the Traffic Circle at Rt. 482 and 2 on side streets.
  
- Community Involvement- HPD officers conducted 245 patrol checks at businesses, parks and schools. During October HPD officers assisted the Carroll County State's Attorney's Office with an initiative to provide treatment to opioid addicts in the Hampstead Area. We were also involved with the following meetings and events:

- DEA Drug Take-back
  - Halloween Patrols
  - Various Emergency and Fire drills and lockdown drills at our local schools.
  - Cpl. Holland and Pfc. Thorn have been teaching drug use prevention training to 8<sup>th</sup> graders at Shiloh Middle School.
  - Pfc. Orem worked with Tim Weber, CCSAO, to get two addicts into treatment.
  - Pfc. Orem conducted a station tour for a Scout Troop.
  - Lt. Gaegler completed a Car seat installation.
- Serious Crime: During October there were no burglaries and 9 thefts reported. 8 of the thefts were from mailboxes and unlocked vehicles in the Roberts Fields Area. Pfc. Cranshaw was able to develop suspects and has charged 5 juveniles in those cases. The remaining theft suspect overdosed on Oxycodone and will be charged at a later time.
- There were 13 Arrests in October; 7 Adults and 6 Juveniles. Charges included Theft- 8 cts. (5), CDS Possession, Traffic Charges-

Other (5), Domestic Assault and (2)  
Warrants from Other Jurisdictions.

- K-9 Activity- Our K-9 Team remains in training in Baltimore City. It appears that the training will be complete on or before December 1<sup>st</sup>.
